

23. Horses which have been in contact with an infectious disease must not attend any event. Current vaccination certificates and passports may be asked for, all Equines must vaccinated with 12 months.
24. Children are to be supervised at all times.
25. DOGS are to be kept on a lead at all times.
- a. Any dog foul must be cleaned up and taken home by the owner.
  - b. Liability for damage caused by dogs rests with the owner.
  - c. No dog is to be left in a hot car or appropriate action will be taken.
26. Do not drop litter on the showground and take any rubbish home with you, or place in the bins provided.
27. Do not muck out horse boxes or trailers on the showground.
28. No liability will be accepted by the committee or organisers for accidents, damage, injury or illness to any person, animal or property whatsoever.

### **Members Only:**

29. Concession entry fee rates will only be given on the production of a current Wrekin North membership card, or with the presence of the members name on the show secretary's list of current members.
30. Points towards the annual awards and trophies will be awarded and only back dated 1 month from the date membership is taken out or renewed.
31. At least 2 shows must be attended with the same horse and rider combination, entered in the same class, for points to count.
32. Double points will be awarded in the **17th May and 13th September** shows.
33. It is the member's responsibility to check the accuracy of the points table on the website or with the point's secretary, Diane Rohan. Any queries must be registered with Diane within 14 days of the results being posted. Any queries after this time will not be considered.
34. Any member shown to have been abusive in any form or to any person while at a WNRC event or bringing the club disrepute elsewhere will have their membership suspended.

**HEALTH AND SAFETY** – The committee has taken every reasonable precaution to ensure health, safety and welfare of those attending the show.
